# THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MATACHEWAN

## BY-LAW NO. 2024-18

#### BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW NO. 2013-15 TO REGULATE THE KEEPING AND REGISTRATION OF BACKYARD CHICKENS IN THE URBAN AREA WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF MATACHEWAN

**WHEREAS** under Section 436 of the Municipality Act, 2001, an officer may enter onto and across any lands, at any reasonable time, without a warrant to conduct an investigation or inspection to ensure the provisions of this By-law are being complied with; and

**WHEREAS** every chicken found running at large contrary to the provisions of this by-law may be seized and impounded; and

**WHEREAS** a chicken/hen has been seized or should be destroyed without delay for humane reasons, the Municipality By-Law Enforcement Officer may dispose of the hen in a humane manner as soon after the seizure as he/she sees fit, without permitting any reason to reclaim the hen and no compensation or damages shall be recovered on account of such disposition.

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Matachewan hereby **ENACTS THE FOLLOWING**:

## 1. Backyard Chickens Regulations

- A maximum of eight (8) chickens/hens shall be allowed on premises zoned 'residential'
- Roosters are strictly prohibited
- Chickens will be kept in the coop between 9:00p.m. and 6:00a.m.
- Each hen is provided with food, water, shelter, light, ventilation, veterinary care if needed and opportunities for essential behaviours such as scratching, dust-bathing, and roosting, all sufficient to maintain the chickens in good health
- Hens must be contained on owner's property and kept in a coop and or run at all times
- Owner of the chickens must reside on or next to the property where the hens are kept
- Rental properties require written permission from the owner
- Multi-residential properties such as apartments are not permitted to have chickens
- All other by-laws will still apply, for example, noise, animal control, property standards

#### 2. Setback Regulations and Compliance Requirements

- Chicken coops are not permitted in a front or side yard
  - -1.2m (3.9ft) from the rear lot line
  - 2.5m (8.2ft) from the side lot line
  - 2.5m (8.2ft) from a rear lot line abutting a side yard

## 3. Coop and Run Regulations and Sanitation

## Structure

- Coop must provide protection from weather and be adequately ventilated
- Have interior walls which are smoothly finished
- Provide each hen with at least 0.37m2 of coop floor area
- Be equipped with at least one perch of not less than 15cm in length and one nest box for each hen
- The floor must be constructed of a material that is resistant to moisture, mold, retain heat in the cold weather and exclude predators
- The floor must be lined with shavings, straw, or other appropriate materials to absorb manure and facilitate cleaning
- The coop and run shall be constructed and maintained in a manner as to prevent the escape of hens
- The coop and run shall be constructed and maintained in a manner to exclude predators and rodents from entry
- The run shall be of sufficient size to provide at least 0.92m2 per hen
- The run provided with a floor of any combination of vegetated or bare earth

## Cleaning

- The coop must be maintained in a clean condition and shall be kept free of odours
- The floor shall be properly washed each week with water and soap or detergent whether the floor is constructed of wood or concrete
- The coop must be deep cleaned 2-3 times a year which includes washing and disinfecting of walls, troughs, perches, and nest boxes
- Manure must be cleaned out daily and stored in a secure container or composter

4. All by-laws, policies and resolutions that are inconsistent with the provisions of this by-law are hereby repealed in so far it is necessary to give effect to the provisions of this by-law.

**READ A FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD TIME, AND FINALLY ENACTED AND PASSED** this 1st day of May, 2024.
